

## WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO BE SUCCESSFUL IN SUMMER SCHOOL?

If you are motivated, organized, and can follow a timeline, you should successfully achieve your goal for summer school. Remember that you have from the time of registration, to July 20th (exams written by 22nd), to complete your course.

## PLEASE NOTE: CLOSURE DATES

We are closed on June 16 for our graduation, on June 26 for our year-end wrap-up, and July 1. Please arrange drop off and pick up of DL materials around those dates.

## SUMMER SCHOOL FEES

If you were 19 years of age or under on September 1, 2019, fees are: **\$125.00** with a \$50 refund once materials are returned.

If you were 20 years of age or older on September 1, 2019, fees are:

**\$100 per credit (core courses \$500)**

Registration will not proceed until fees are paid in full.

*Withdrawal refunds will not be issued for DL courses.*

*Note: You may write your final exam when courses are successfully completed and all textbooks have been returned.*

# QUESTIONS ABOUT SUMMER SCHOOL

## WHEN IS SUMMER SCHOOL?

Registrations are accepted between May 1 and June 15, 2020 for academic courses, and extended to June 20, 2020 for option classes. You may begin your course upon registration. **All coursework must be completed by Monday July 20.** July 21 and 22 are test-writing days only. Marks will be submitted to Alberta Education on July 23, 2020.

## HOW DO I REGISTER?

Call VPHS to schedule an appointment with an administrator. Registration packages can be printed from the VPHS website. Complete the forms and bring them along with you to your intake meeting. Please also bring your birth certificate or a copy of it if you are an out of Division student.

*\*Fees must be paid in full using School Cash Online no later than a week after your intake meeting.*

## CAN I TAKE MORE THAN ONE CLASS?

Usually you can take one core class in the summer session however, an appropriate course load and schedule will be developed at the intake meeting.

## WHAT IS THE METHOD OF INSTRUCTION?

All courses are completed with Distributed Learning materials and with one-to-one teacher support as needed through an online communication tool like Teams.



## WHAT HAPPENS IF I DON'T FINISH MY COURSE BY JULY 20?

The intention is that all summer school courses be completed in the timeframe provided upon intake. A final mark will be submitted on July 23 for all Summer School courses whether that is a pass or a fail. Should you wish to complete the course the following semester as a credit recovery, please make an appointment to meet with an administrator at VPHS in the fall semester to make these arrangements. Remember, if you need the course as a prerequisite for a course you'll be starting in September, you must have finished the course by July 20th.
